The school also undertakes additional actions with regard to school improvement of PE. This year the school are preparing for assessment of the PE quality mark and are undertaking a detailed audit of this.

In addition to the spending above using Sports Premium the school also funds further sporting activity in order to meet curriculum requirements. This includes:

- Provision for meeting NC requirements in swimming £6673 – This cost is for the Year 6 cohort and in addition this year, Year 5 will also undertake swimming in order that next year any not meeting the standard have time for additional sessions.
- The allocation of sports premium does not cover the entire cost of Greater Goals provision and therefore the school spends an additional £3922 to top up this provision.
- The provision of subject leader release time (6 days) for the development of PE across the school HLTA cover @ £77 per day = £462
