peace - an end to riots and fighting

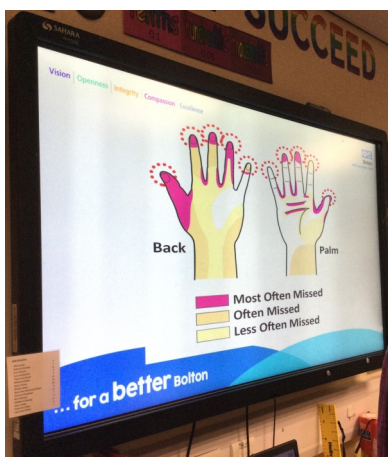
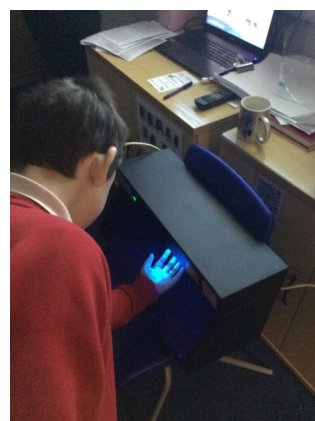


Hand Washing
