You will have, today, received your mini reports to supplement the information that we would normally give out at parent conferences. Please return your letters about your telephone ap-



You may have noticed that there have been a few changes to the school grounds since lockdown. Over the next few newsletters, we will draw your attention to these different areas and the school's plans for them.

The first area which has seen huge improvements is the KS1 outdoor area, which through the hard work of many staff, has been transformed into a lovely outdoor space for children to explore nature, climb and take part in outdoor lessons, including reading.

Work within this area has included:

- ♦ Removal of several bushes
- Cutting back of foliage to allow the pathways to be accessed
- Replacement of the bark flooring
- New stump seating
- ♦ Creation of wildflower beds
- Creation of two new bug hotels
- ♦ Creation of wooden signs
- ♦ Creation of laminated learning prompts
- Planting of herbs and flowers

The KS1 staff, who were heavily involved in this area's renovation, are rightly proud of their efforts, which during finer weather, will enable the children to participate in increased outdoor leaning opportunities. We look forward to seeing them enjoy this lovely space.
