When I grow up I would like to be:

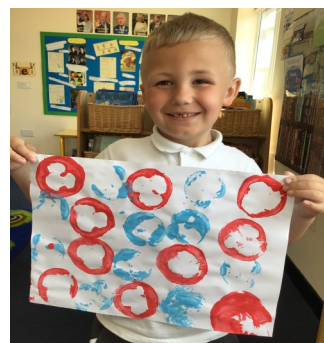
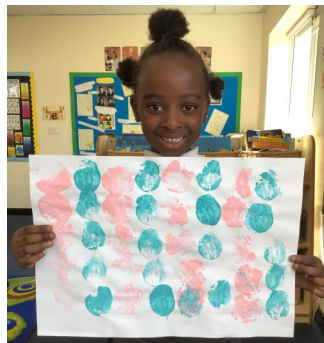
At the moment, I really don't know!
