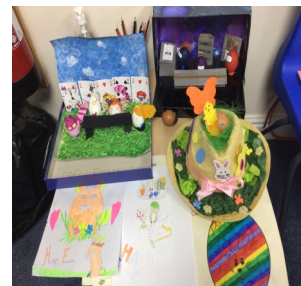

When I grow up I would like to be:

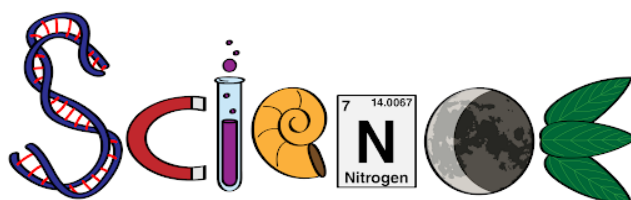

Science, alongside many other subject areas in school has undergone a lot of revision, updating long term plans and ensure that missed units of work from last year are caught up. We have also introduced knowledge organisers for each topic, helping to guide the children through key ideas and vocabulary. As the use and understanding of scientific words is key to the subject, we have also started to use LBQ tasks to support this, alongside a whole range of discussion activities.

Red Lane has also begun the process of renewing our PSQM award for science, ensuring that quality curriculum and learning opportunities are provided for all children. One big area of future development will be improving the use of the school's outdoor spaces to provide the children with real learning experiences. Looking around the school, you will begin to see these changes in the form of chalk boards, new seating areas and planters. In addition to this, the old growing beds have now been flattened and seeded with wild flowers, ready for Summer!
