


RL Roundup- 12.11.21

**ACCELERATED READER*

Your child may also have told you about how we use Accelerated Reader in school? AR is a computer program that helps teachers manage and monitor children's independent reading practice. Your child picks a book at his or her own level and reads it at their own pace. When finished, your child takes a short quiz on the computer. (Passing the quiz is an indication that your child understood what was read.) Accelerated Reader gives children and teachers feedback based on the quiz results, which the teacher then uses to help your child set goals and direct ongoing reading practice. https://www.renaissance.com/2016/09/09/parents-guide-renaissance-accelerated-reader-360/

You should either tonight or in the coming days receive an leaflet outlining our school's **attendance procedures.** The government have stated that from September 2020 all children must return to school, so as to minimise the longer-term impact of the pandemic on your children's education,

wellbeing and wider development. Missing out on more time in the classroom will put your child at risk of falling further behind. Children with higher overall absence tend to achieve less well in both primary and secondary school. Schools and the Education Welfare Team will be working with families to secure regular school attendance from the start of the autumn term so as to help pupil s catch up on missed education, make progress and promote their wellbeing and wider development. School attendance has therefore been mandatory again from the beginning of the autumn term — September 2020. This means that the usual rules on compulsory school attendance apply.

In order to promote high levels of attendance, we have talked with the school council about how to reward good attendance and punctuality. So......

Each week, any class who scores 96% or above for their class attendance will get an extra play time. This is announced in Friday's star assembly and you will get a text to inform you if your child's class wins this.

Class Dojo Update! We have been informed that some parents are paying for class dojo. Please do NOT do this! The version we use is free and if you scan the QR code given to you it should prompt you to use the correct version of the application. If you are paying for this we urge you to cancel it immediately.

Also, we are using Class Dojo more and more to communicate with parents and for remote teaching. If you do not have the app yet please ask your child's teacher for another invite and we can set you up straight away.

Also, based on feedback from parents and pupils, we have changed the way we do our 100% attendance half termly and termly rewards. Each week, any child who is on time and in school each day will have their names entered into a raffle. This raffle will be built up over the half term and on the last day will be drawn. The more, your child is in school and on time, the more raffle tickets they will get! But it does mean that an odd absence or a medical appointment won't affect their whole half term or term.

Remembrance Day

On Thursday the whole school took part in a 2 minute silence to honour the armed forces who have fallen in the line of duty. The children have also talked about why this day is so important and have even created some of their own poppies which can be seen on our Twitter page. We have also created our own Remembrance Artwork which can be viewed in the Main Office.



Reception


