REMINDER - SAFEGUARDING - OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Our school is part of a project that runs in partnership with Bolton Safeguarding Children Partnership and Greater Manchester Police. The project, Bolton Encompass, has been designed to provide early reporting to schools of any domestic abuse incidents that occur outside of school but which might have an impact on a child attending school the following day.

A nominated member of school staff, known as a Key Adult, is appointed to liaise with the police. The school's Key Adult will be able to use information that has been shared, in confidence, to ensure that the school is able to support children and their families.


Eco Councils Eco Tip:

As part of the Inclusion Quality Mark Centre of Excellence North West Cluster, Red Lane were invited to take part in a multi-sport Panathlon event in March. The event was hosted by Panathlon and Bolton Wanderers in the Community at Bolton Arena. Eight children from across Key Stage 2 were selected to represent Red Lane and they did magnificently.

At the initial event, children took part in eight different sporting activities and had a guided tour of the University of Bolton Stadium. The Red Lane team were superb, at the end the eight events we finished second and Bolton Wanderers star MJ Williams presented the children with their medals.

Having performed so well, the team were invited back to represent Bolton at the North West Area Finals: schools from Blackpool, Oldham, Warrington and Salford were also in attendance. With one of the youngest mixed age teams, the children yet again performed brilliantly, finishing fifth overall. Medals were presented by Paralympian Nathan Maguire and one of our Year 6 students, Dylan, even had the opportunity to race against him - and Dylan won!







Football



On Thursday 5th May we participated in the Bolton School's 6 aside football tournament. With 40 schools taking part, it was a huge event. We were drawn in group F alongside: Devonshire Road, Brownlow Fold, SS Peter and Paul and Markland Hill.
