#### Year 4

Welcome back after the Easter break. As we enter Summer Term, Year 4 have another exciting half-term ahead. Over the next few weeks, we will be learning about a range of subjects:

- Geography: Manchester
- Art: Painting (with a focus on the artist, L. S. Lowry)
- Science: Habitats, with a particular focus on the use of identification keys
- RE: Pentecost
- PSHCE: One World, linked to fair trade and environmental issues
- PE: Striking and fielding, with a focus on cricket and rounders

Within English, our new text from which we will base our writing is Roald Dahl's James and the Giant Peach. So far, the children are loving the story, which has produced some wonderful pieces of writing. Keep up the hard work Year 4!

In Maths we continue our focus on decimals, with money and time being the other two units of study this half-term.

Both class teachers would like to remind children to read as often as possible to help build reading fluency and stamina. Whilst we are quickly approaching the time when Year 4 children across England and Wales will be sitting their multiplication tables check, we would encourage pupils to practise on TT Rockstars (especially Sound Check) as often as possible, concentrating on tables which they find more difficult. Within school, children will log onto the official government website to practise undertaking the tables check, so that they are familiar with what they will face. It has to be said, that all children appear to have taken this in their stride! Well done!

On a different note, we would like to announce that a letter will be sent out very soon, outlining a year group trip to the Anderson Centre in July.

The Anderson Centre is an outward bounds organisation based on the banks of Lower Rivington Reservoir. During this trip, they will have the opportunity to experience kayaking, archery, raft building and other outdoor learning activities. More details about this trip will be outlined within the letter.

Finally, for those parents who were not able to attend the KS2 science meeting, the presentation is available to look at on the school's website, alongside downloadable parent guides.

Thank you again for your continued support and we look forward to yet another positive half-term.

#### Year 5

#### Year 6

Year 6 have returned for a busy, exciting and important final term at Red Lane. As I am sure you are all aware, the KS2 SATs tests are rapidly approaching and the work we have been undertaking has focused on the revision of prior learning. At this time, it is vital that all children are in school as consistently as possible.

Although we hosted a meeting regarding the SATs last week, we are aware that not all parents and guardians were able to attend. We focused on a few key elements to help ensure the week goes smoothly: children will be asked to arrive at school for 8:25AM, meeting in the dining room with a breakfast provided during the week beginning Monday 9th May; in preparation, we will offer a practise run through of this arrangement on Thursday 5th May; plenty of sleep in the days building to the tests will help the children perform to their best; completion of the weekly arithmetic homework will give them the opportunity to practise specific skills required for the arithmetic test; and daily reading of 15 to 20 minutes will aid the children's reading stamina in preparing them for the hour long reading test. We do not want to add any additional stress to the children at this stage, but these simple steps will help make a great difference.

We will continue to work as hard as ever in school, ensuring that the children feel confident as the tests arrive and look forward to the celebrations that will inevitably follow.

Whilst SATs are the current primary focus, many Year 6 children are also looking forward to the PGL trip. A meeting held last week, gave the opportunity for parents to hear a little more about the upcoming visit and ask any questions. However, if you were unable to attend, please do not worry. Speak to any of the Year 6 team and keep an eye out for future letters, which will share further details about the residential.
