Picture the word in your mind.

WRITE



Write down the word,
remembering how it sounds
and what it looks like.

CHECK



Check to see if it is correct.
Tick the letters you got correct.
Write the word correctly if you made any mistakes.

The following table is a list of sounds, rules and spellings your child will be learning this year and some examples of words you may want to practise.

Sound or Spelling Rule	Examples of words
Adding suffixes	forgetting, forgotten, beginning, beginner, begging.
The sound spelt y within the word	myth, gym, Egypt, mystery, pyramid.
The word spelt ou	touch, young, double, trouble, country.
Prefixes	dishearten, dislike, dislodge rebound, rebuild, recycle antiseptic, antisocial, anticlockwise, miscount, misdeal, misfire, misfortune, misinform, misread, misbehave, misplace, mistake, unable, unwell, unhappy, untidy, interactive, internet, international, immature, immortal, impossible, irregular, irrelevant, irresponsible superhero, superman, supermarket, autobiography, autograph, automatic, subway, subdivide, subheading.
The suffix -ation	Information, adoration, sensation, preparation, admiration.
The suffix -ly	sadly,, completely, usually, finally, comically.
The sound spelt -ure	measure, treasure, pleasure, enclosure, adventure.
The sound spelt -sion	division, invasion, confusion, decision, collision.
The suffix -ous	poisonous, dangerous, mountainous, famous, various.
The sound spelt -tion, -sion, -ssion, -cian	invention, injection, action, hesitation, completion.
The sound spelt ch	scheme, chorus, chemist, echo, character.
Words ending with the sound spelt -gue and -que	league, tongue, catalogue, dialogue, epilogue.
The sound spelt sc	science, scene, discipline, fascinate, crescent.
The sound spelt ei, eigh or ey	sleigh, neigh, eight, weight, neighbour.
Possessive apostrophe with plural words	girls', boys', babies', children's, men's, mice's
Homophones and near-homophones	accept, except, affect, effect, ball, bawl, berry, bury, brake, break, fair, fare, grate, great, groan, grown, here, hear, heel, heal, he'll, knot, not, mail, male, main, mane, meat, meet, medal, meddle, missed, mist, peace, piece, plain, plane, rain, rein, reign, scene, seen, weather, whether, whose, who's
